Pop-up Booth	Staff set up a pop-up booth at seven community events during the summer and fall of 2018: three in South Sacramento, two in West Arden-Arcade and two in North Highlands.	At these events, visitors took a survey to receive a small prize and participated in a prioritization exercise where they chose which issues were most important to them. Over 100 residents of EJ Communities participated in the surveys with numerous residents of other communities participating as well.
Web Survey	Staff created a web-based survey available in seven different languages (English, Spanish, Chinese, Tagalog, Vietnamese, Russian, and Hindi). Survey participants answered questions related to environmental justice topics. Data was aggregated and utilized by staff in policy development and in determining community priorities.	The survey was open to people residing or working in zip codes that include EJ Communities during October and November 2018. A total of 719 individuals participated.  Staff created additional surveys to provide to community hub groups to allow for additional distribution. Sacramento Area Congregations Together (Sacramento ACT) distributed the survey and collected 182 responses. Black Child Legacy of North Highlands/Foothill Farms distributed the survey and collected 10 responses.
